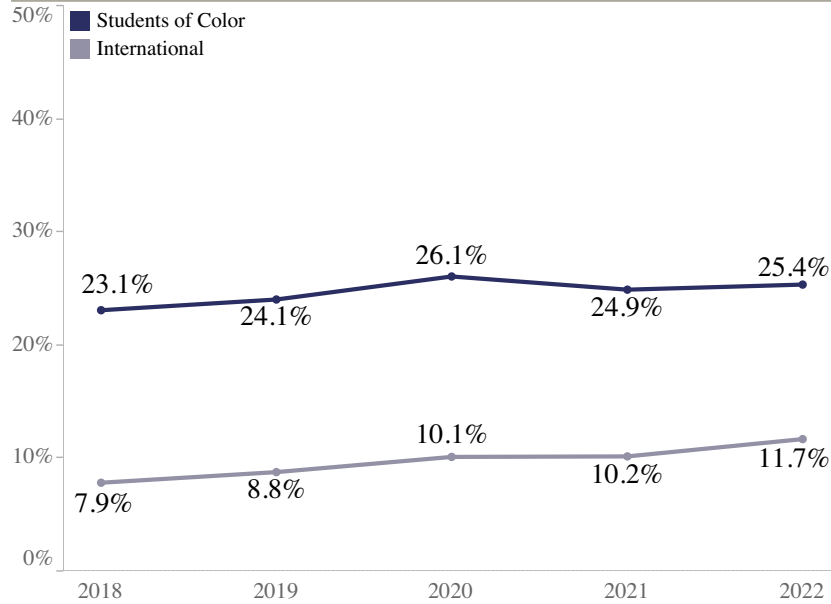

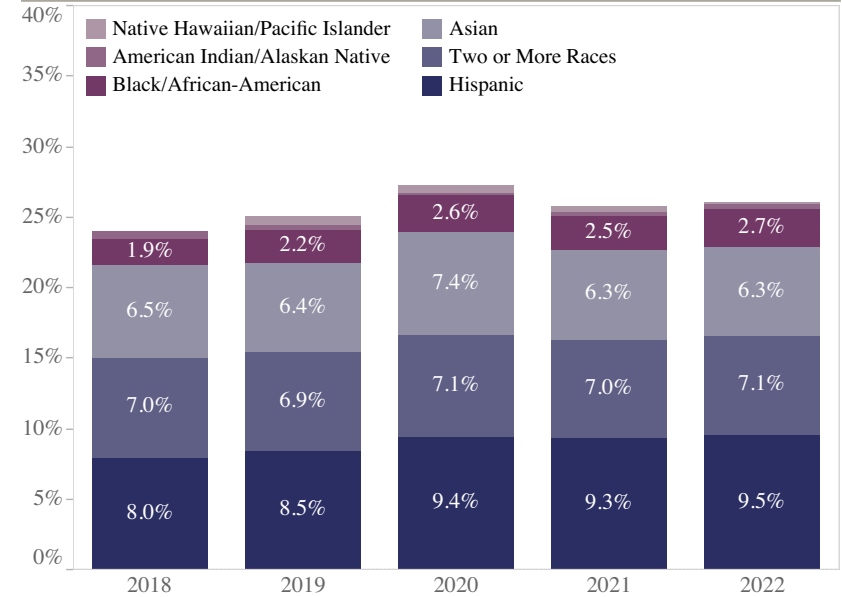

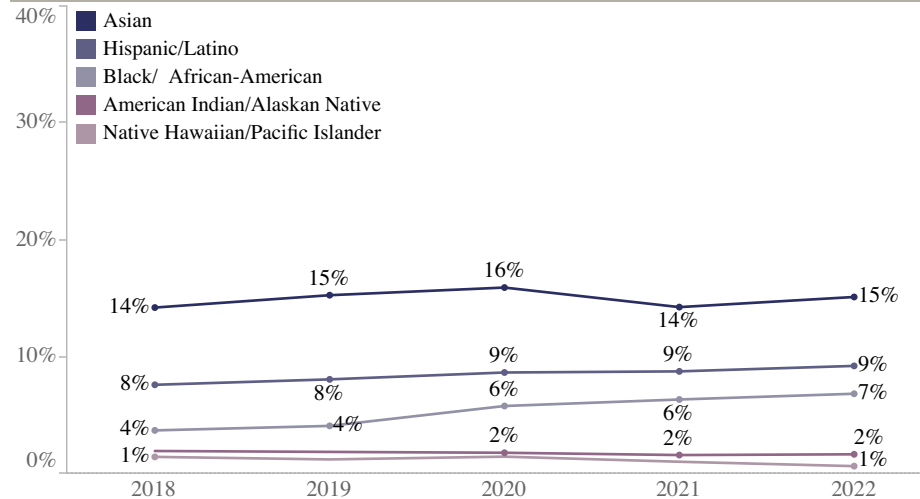
### Students of Color and International Students (IPEDS Categories)



### Students of Color at Whitman



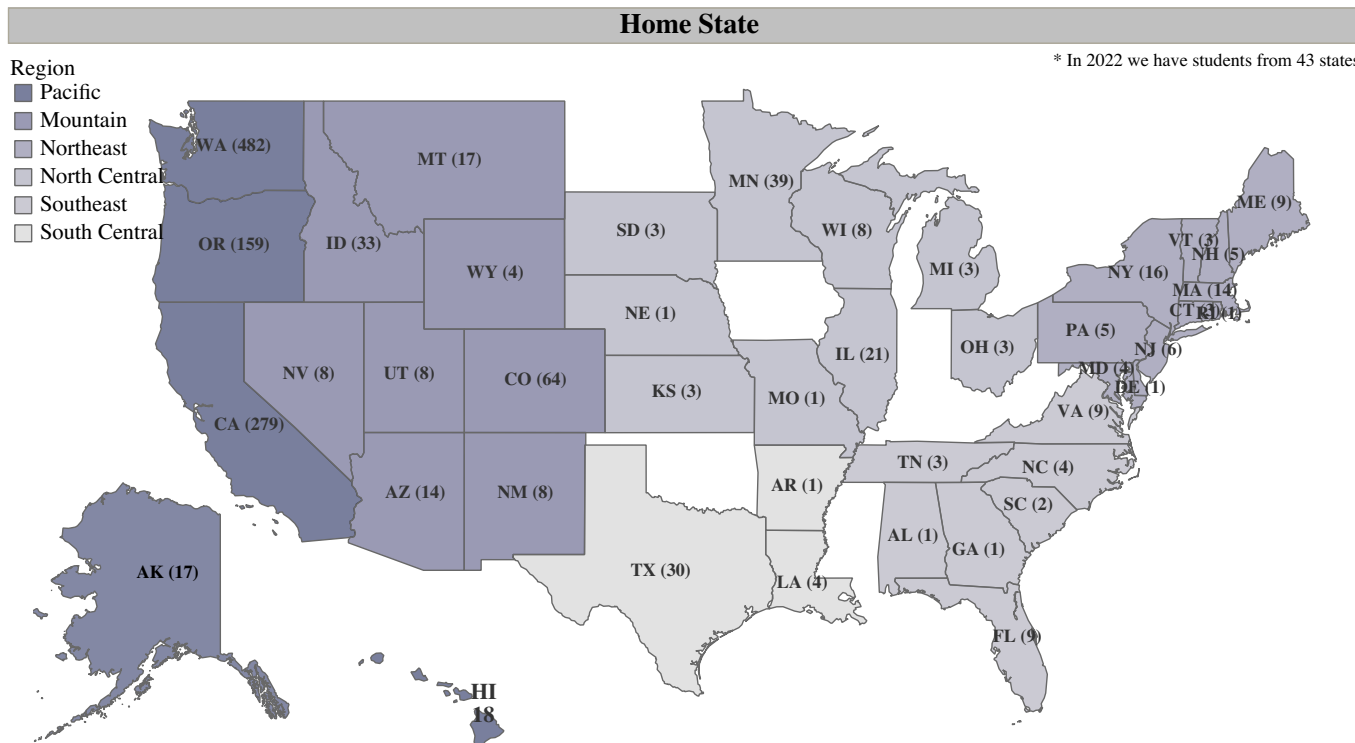
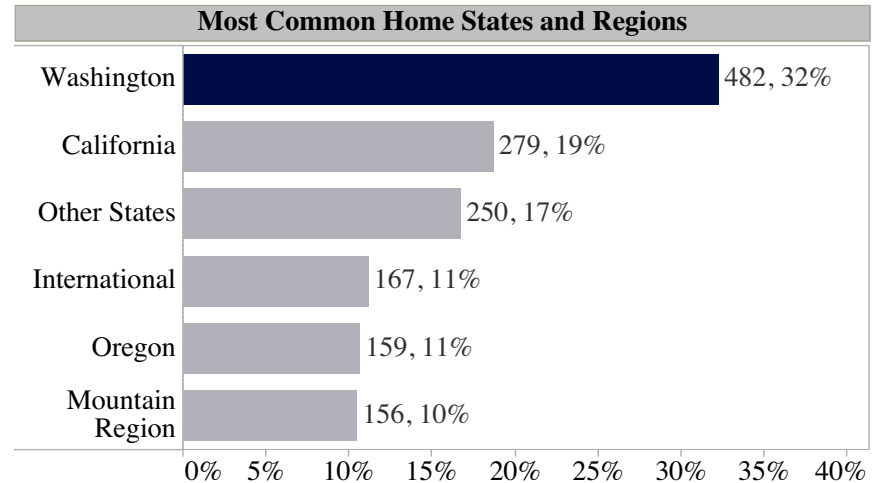

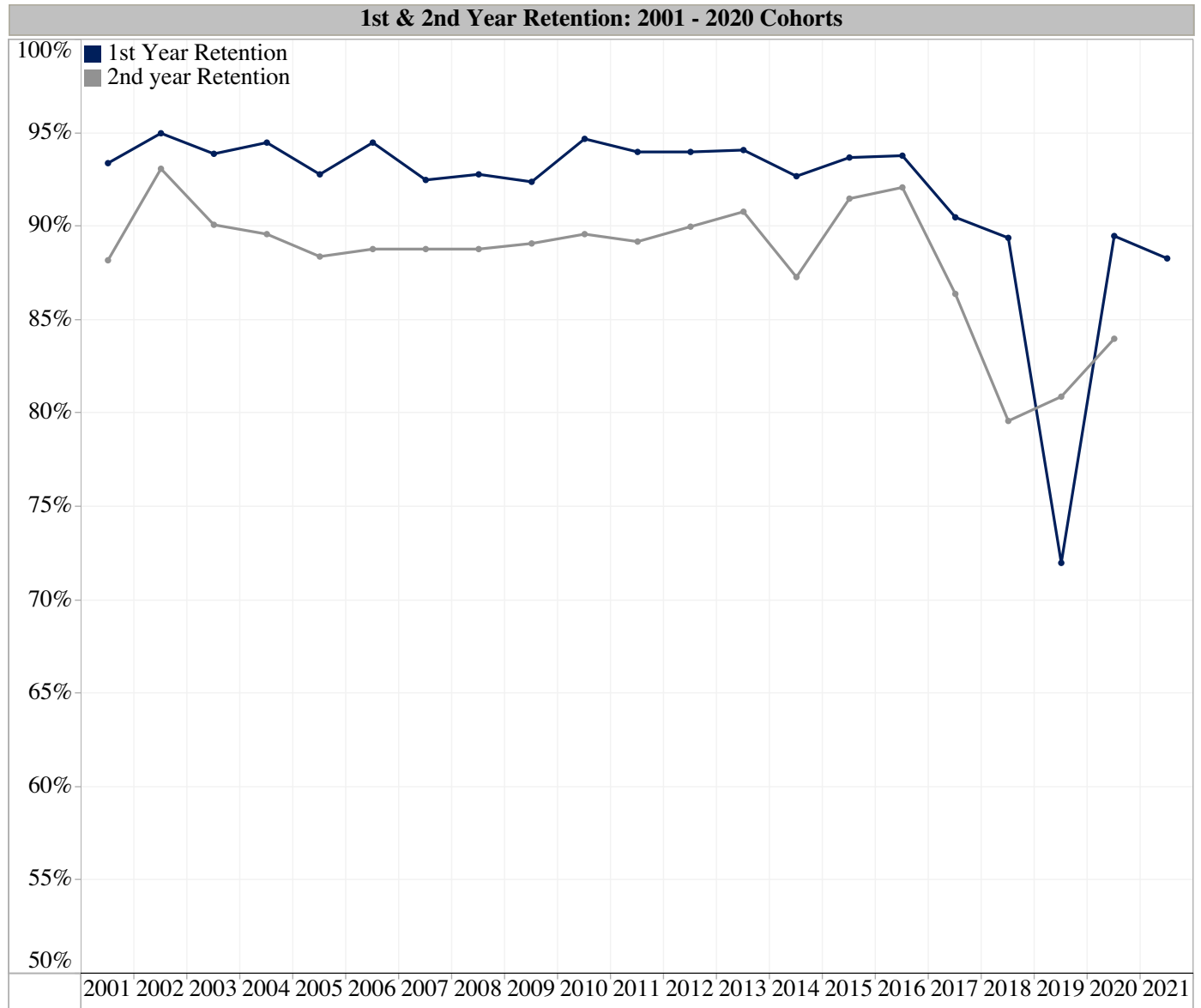

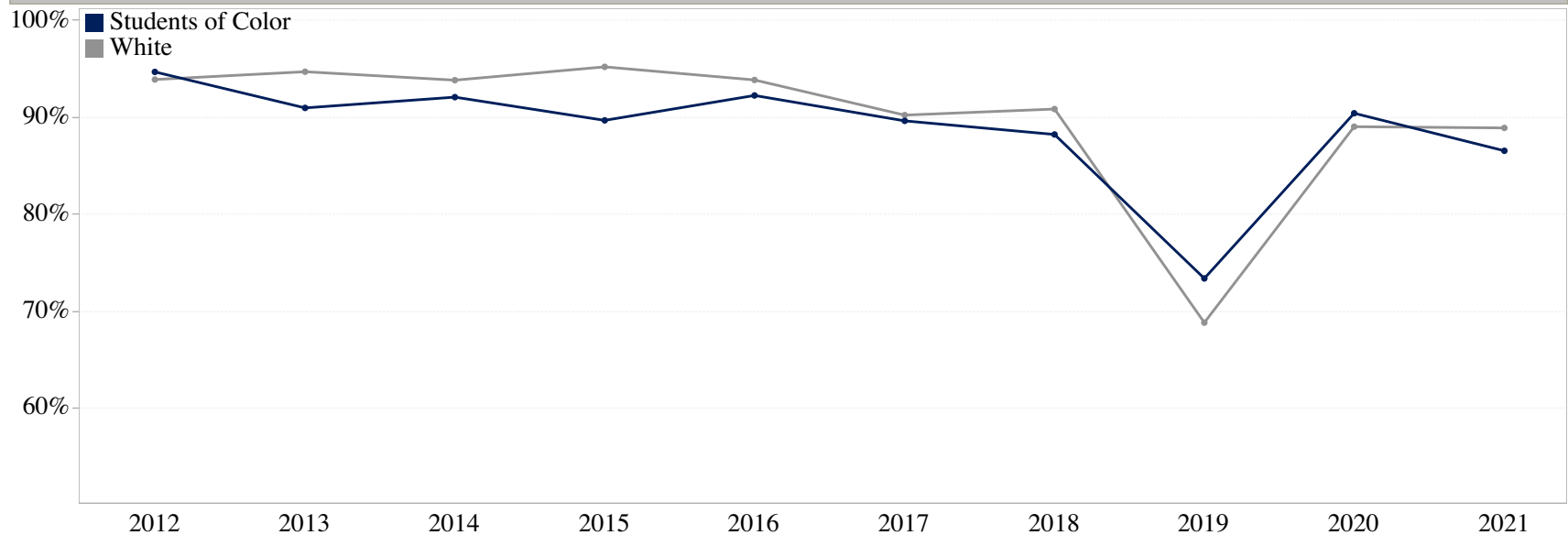

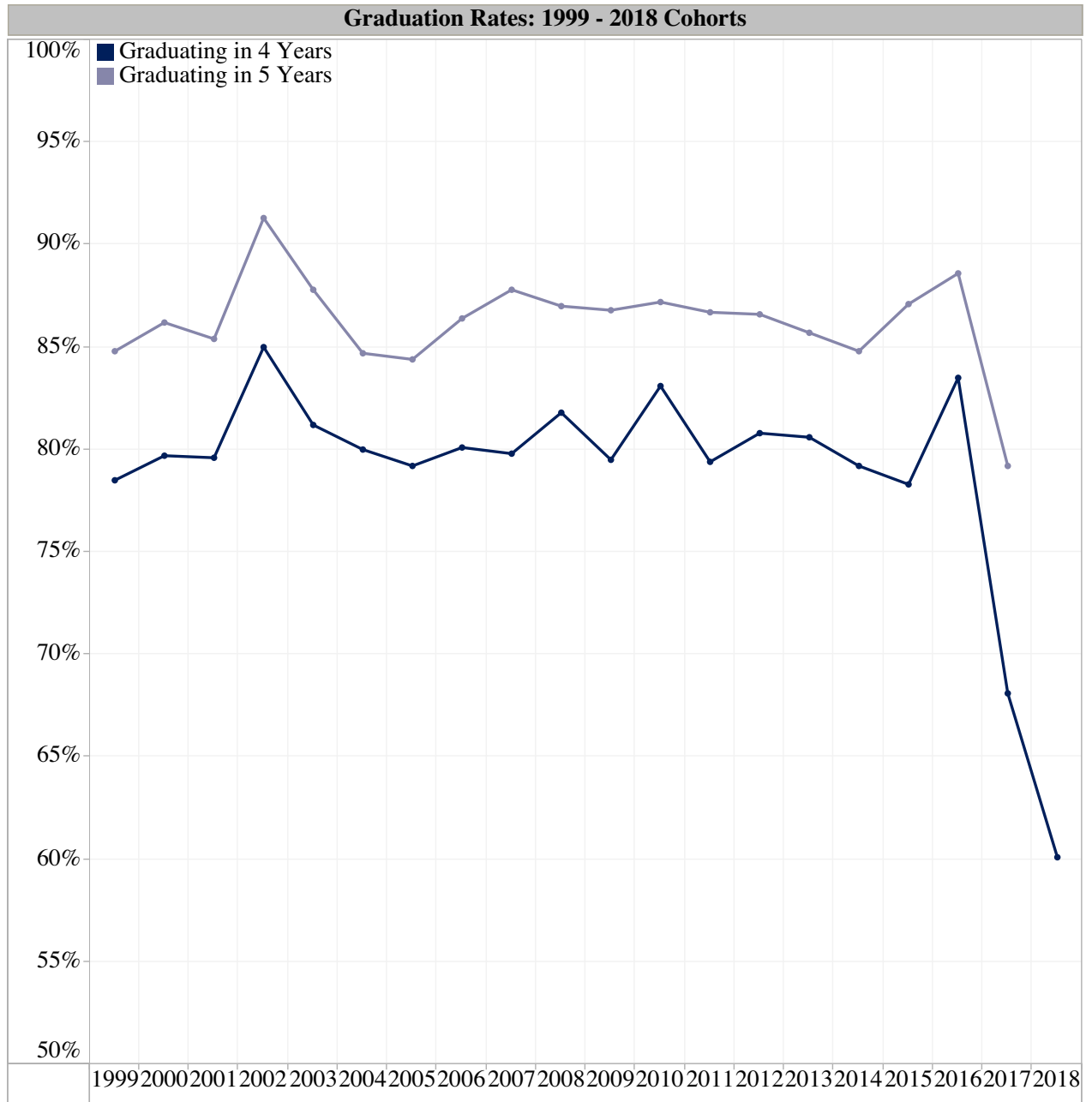

**1st Year Retention: 2012 - 2021**



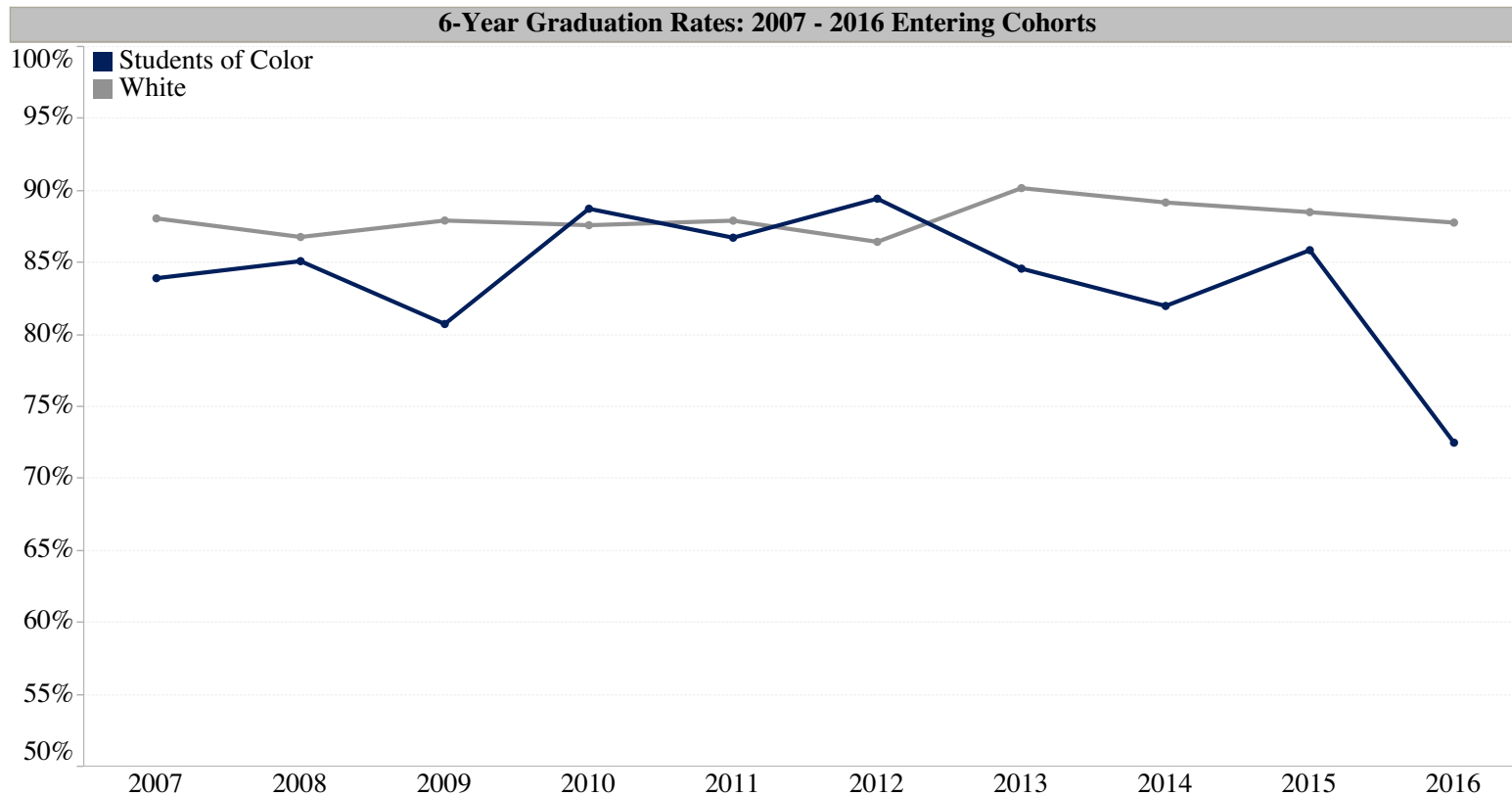

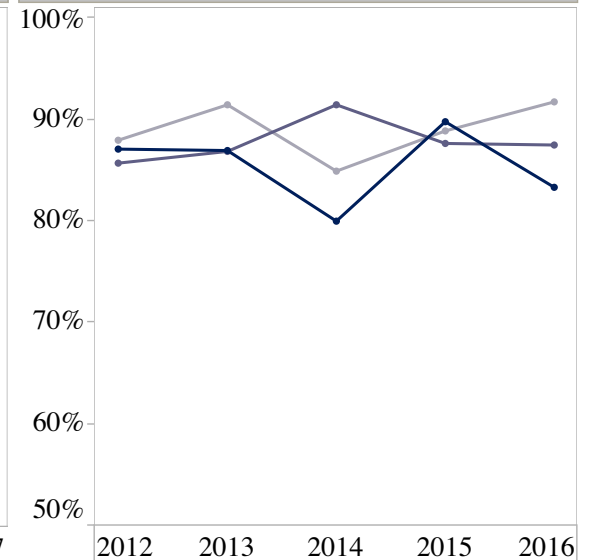
**4-Year Graduation Rate**

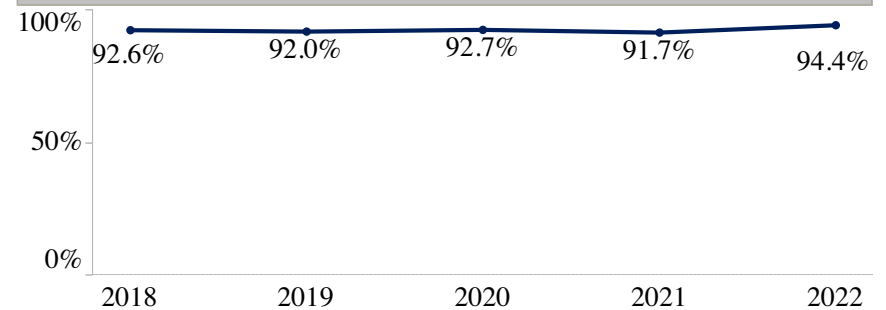
## % Full Time and Part Time



## Tenure Status of Full Time Faculty



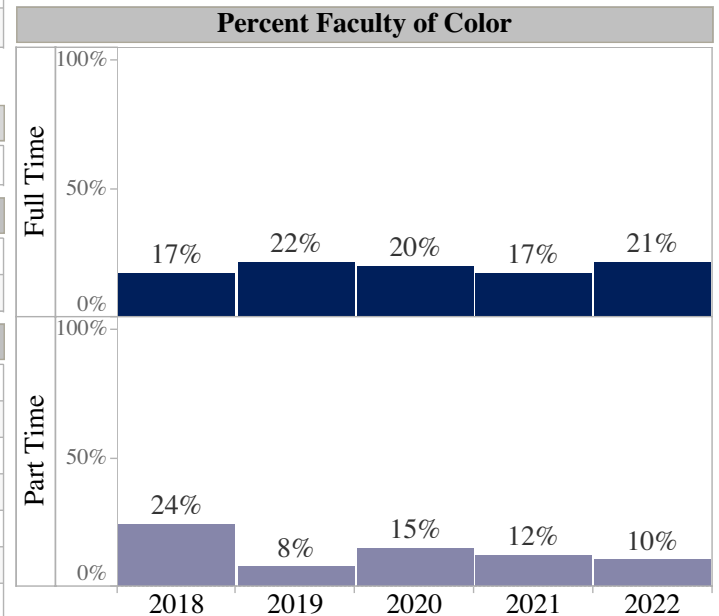
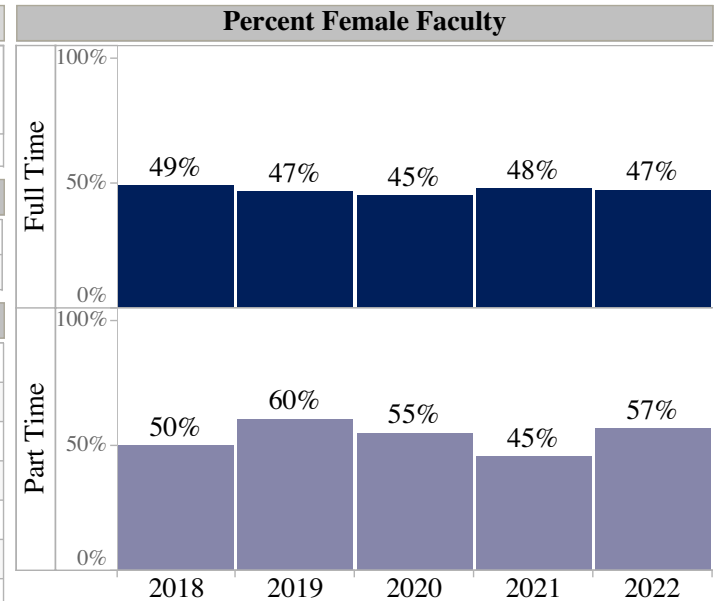

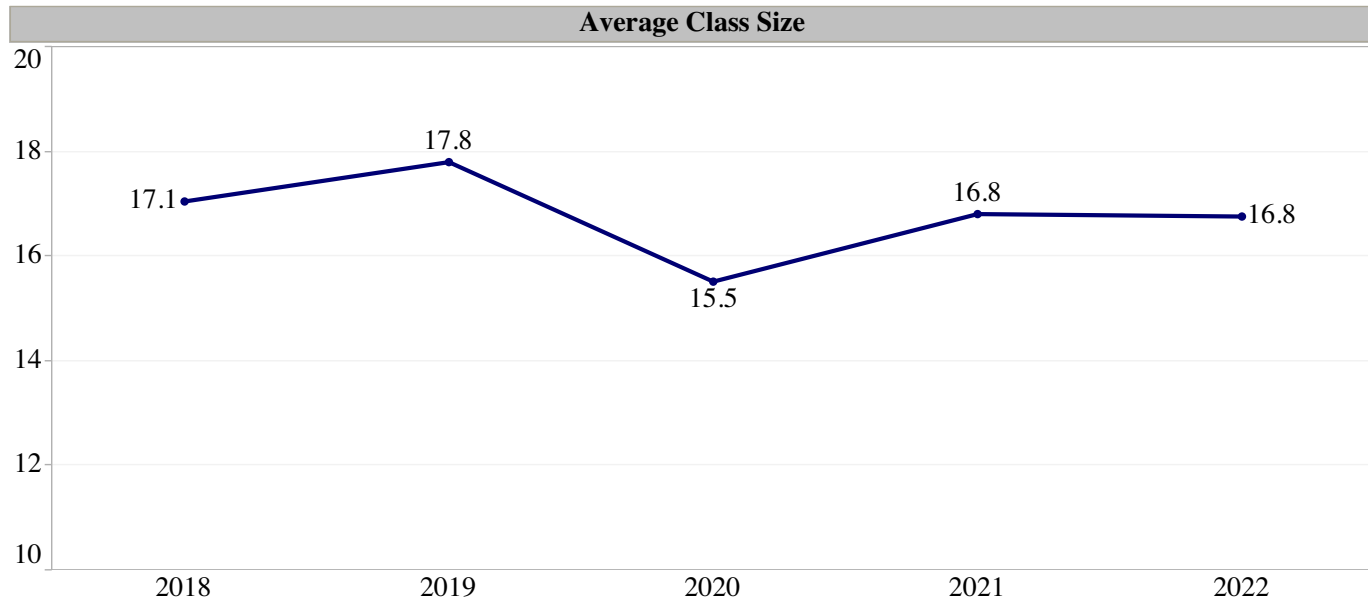
